## Implementation

- To deliver a curriculum which ensures coverage of Christianity and other religions from EYFS to Year 6.
- To engage pupils in exploring questions about their study of religion and beliefs.

• To provide opportunities for pupils to reflect on their own beliefs and the views of others, in a thoughtful and respectful way.

- Provide daily worship and opportunities to celebrate as part of the community our school is part of.
- To visit and take part in special Christian events at our local churches (St Michael's and All Angels Church Ingram Valley and St Maurice's church Eglingham) e.g. participate in Harvest, Christmas and Easter services.

## Impact

- Children have knowledge and understanding of Christianity and other religions represented in our country.
- Children retain the knowledge they have previously been taught and build upon it.
- Children discuss, reason and make decisions about religious, ethical and moral issues.
- Children experience visiting places of religion and the people who work in these places.
- Children reflect on their personal experiences and develop the confidence in their own beliefs, values and identity.
- Children have positive attitudes and accept that others may have different views.
- Children share a sense of belonging and responsibility as a member of a diverse community; locally, nationally and globally.
- A curriculum that promotes spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of our pupils and helps them prepare for responsibilities and experiences of life.
