Implementation

- We deliver the PSHE and RSE curriculum mainly through Kapow and linking to events like Place 2be and Anna Freud Mental Wellbeing.
- Our planning is based around five areas of learning: Families and relationships, Health and wellbeing, Safety and the changing body, Citizenship, Economic wellbeing.
- Each area is revisited every year to allow children to build on prior learning. The lessons provide a progressive programme.
- Implement a Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) in order to teach the characteristics of positive relationships including what a relationship is, what family means and who are the people who can support them.
- Ensure effective teaching is communicated to children in a carefully sequenced way, within a planned sequence of lessons.
- Give children the opportunity to give their opinions.
- Many lessons, stories, scenarios, and video clips provide the opportunity for children to engage in real life and current topics in a safe and structured way. Role-play activities are also included to help children play out scenarios that they may find themselves in.
- •Our unique environment is used to maximise of learning opportunities especially around mental wellbeing.
